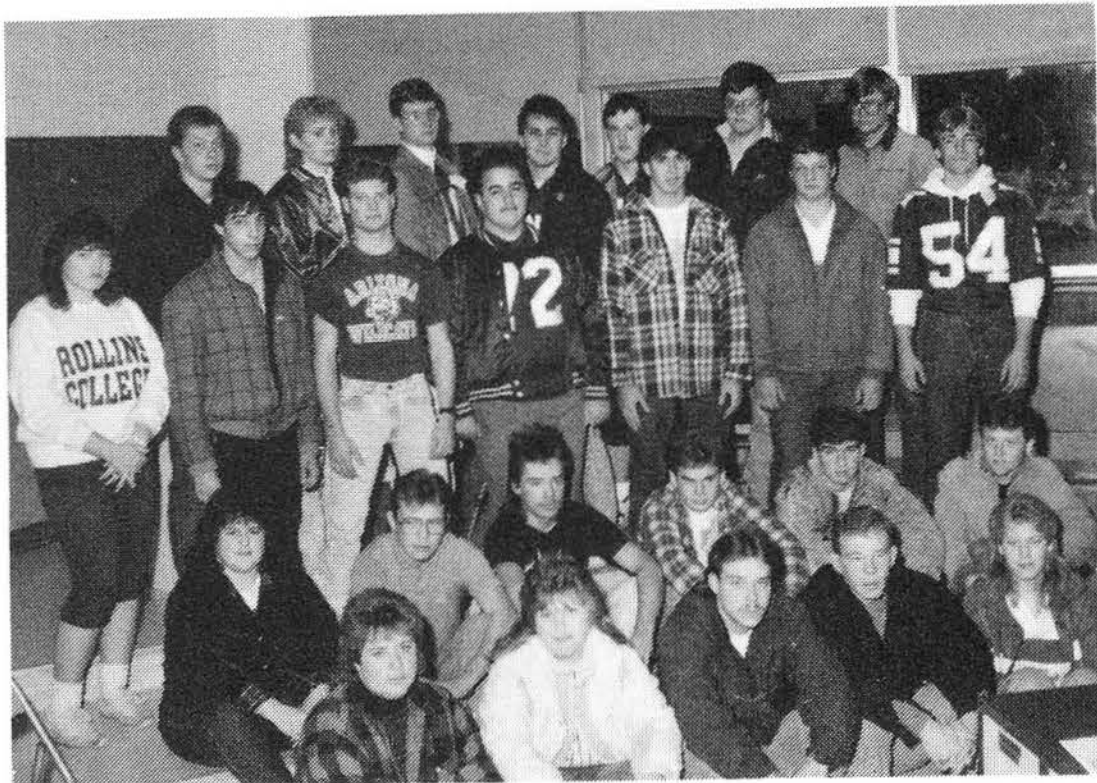
cultural mechanics, and electronics.
