dual Medley and 3rd in the 100 Breaststroke (Sectionals).

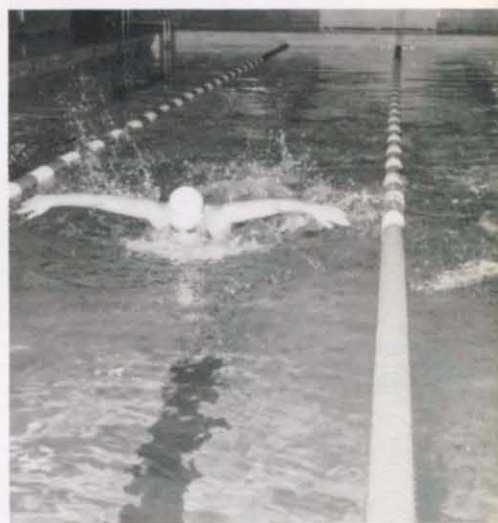
