Characteristics of the JV Boys Basketball team's season were enthusiasm, improvement, and competition. It was a season of growth and polishing of skill.

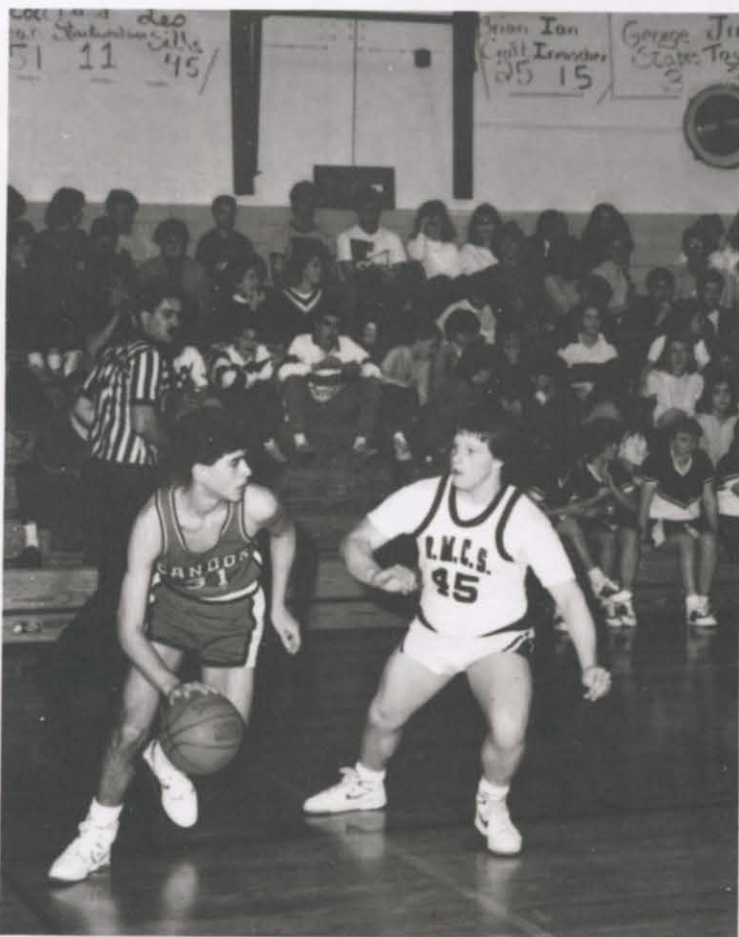
